These include **professional ethics, gender equity, human values, environmental concerns, and sustainability**. These themes are embedded across various semesters and courses in both direct and contextual forms.

1. Professional Ethics

- Courses like **MJC 2 (Constitutional Government and Democracy in India)** and **MJC 6 (Perspectives on Public Administration)** emphasize constitutional values, rule of law, accountability, transparency, and integrity—cornerstones of professional ethics in public service and political engagement.
- Discussions on **public policy, administrative responsibility, bureaucratic neutrality, and citizen-centric governance** cultivate ethical conduct and accountability.

2. Gender

- Courses such as **MJC 1 (Understanding Political Theory)** and **MJC 15 (Indian Political Thought - II)** include **feminist perspectives** and key contributions by women thinkers (e.g., Pandita Ramabai).
- Topics like **gender justice, affirmative action, and politics of representation** help students critically examine gender inequality and advocate inclusive policies.
- Gender is also addressed under electoral behavior, party politics, and political participation (e.g., MJC 4 and MJC 8).

3. Human Values

- Courses across semesters focus on **justice, liberty, equality, and human dignity** (e.g., MJC 3 and MJC 11), cultivating empathy, respect, and tolerance.
- The **Indian Constitution**, as studied in MJC 2 and MIC 2, is presented as a living document embedding human values.
- Thinkers like **Gandhi, Ambedkar, and Lohia** (MJC 15) offer ethical frameworks for nation-building rooted in moral responsibility and compassion.

4. Environment and Sustainability

- Contemporary political theory (MJC 1) includes **environmentalism** and **sustainable development** as critical frameworks.
- Students explore global environmental governance, climate diplomacy, and sustainability policies through **MJC 10 (Global Politics)** and topics on global institutions (e.g., UN, WTO, SDGs).
- Local governance and decentralization in MJC 9 cover grassroots movements and rural development with sustainable practices.
